APPLICATION DOCUMENTS:

Before you tour apartments, gather all of your documentation. That way, you can apply and/or sign a lease on the spot. Landlords typically expect you to have the following:

- ✓ Photo ID
- ✓ Proof of income (2+ paystubs, most recent tax return, employer contact info)
- ✓ Previous addresses (last three locations or five years)
- ✓ Personal check (or other accepted payment method for the application fee)

Pro tip: Landlords will also likely run a check on your credit history as part of the application process. CreditRepair.com can help make sure your score is in tip-top shape before you apply.

QUESTIONS FOR APARTMENT TOUR:

Here are the questions we recommend you ask, as well as blank lines for you to write down questions of your own:

- Which utilities does the apartment complex cover? Are they included in rent or in addition to rent?
- Which utilities need to go in my name?
- What are your rules regarding pets? How much is the pet deposit and rent?
- What are the accepted payment methods for rent? What is the grace period?
- What are the policies regarding subleasing or breaking a lease?
- What are the guest policies?
- Are there any amenities in this community?

 How do I submit maintenance requests? How long does it usually take for those to be handled?
